Overall purpose of the activity is to provide students a general overview of the historical events that were taking place in the US during the period of 1825 to 1850. These events helped tremendously in transforming the US from a young country to the economic giant it is today.

The skills you will be learning in this activity include:

Self and peer assessment



This activity focuses on the early development of the market revolution in the US and the attempts by Americans to settle the western part of the US.
